The Sandown Heritage Commission has contracted the reprint of the book, a third edition, with the original publisher, Peter Randall Publishing. This book is a compilation of Mr. Holmes' careful research that unraveled the tangle of fact and fiction to craft an accurate and very readable history which includes:

- ~ When soldiers from across the state rushed to rescue Sandown from the British.
- ~ The 1786 attempt to overthrow the state's government.
- ~ John Colby who was captured by Native Americans and forced to walk barefoot to Canada.
- ~ The Sandown teacher who was hanged for murder.
- ~ In 1800, the town paid Reverend John Webber \$100 to leave Sandown.
- ~ The tale of the great Sandown monster.

Chapters are devoted to the religious, social, and military history of the town. Other sections cover the Old Meeting House, agriculture, taverns, the railroad and the schools. Among the 100 illustrations are maps and many rare photographs, some never before published.
