Updated 4/8/20 Town Modifications:

- There has been an increasing trend for residents to host “birthday parades” in place of traditional birthday parties. Although not run by the town, residents are encouraged to coordinate through a Facebook page that has been created called “Sandown Birthday Parades.” Residents are also reminded that all motor vehicle laws apply and people should not be hanging out of car windows or sunroofs.
