Updated 5/27/20 Town Modifications:

- There will be a Board of Selectman meeting Monday, June 1, 2020.
- All Town Buildings remain closed to the public.
- The Board of Selectmen will discuss the re-opening plan for all town departments again on Monday, June 1, 2020. This will be a phased process and will closely follow recommendations and orders of the Governor.
- ALL Town business should be conducted virtually. Town Hall has a locked drop box at the Town Clerk/Tax Collector's office entrance which faces the Fire Station. Paperwork can be left in this box and will be checked often throughout the day.
- Contact Town Hall at 887-3646 or townofsandown@sandown.us. If you cannot or are unsure how to conduct your business online and someone will assist you.
- Tax bills will be mailed on Thursday, May 28, 2020 and are due on or before July 1, 2020. Please pay your taxes via the following options: on-line at www.sandown.us, use the locked drop box or via first class mailed postmarked by July 1, 2020. Please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope if you would like a receipt returned to you.
- The automatic extension for NH DMV 20-day plates and NH authorized dealer 20-day plates is ending on May 31, 2020. Vehicles must be registered by that date to remain in compliance with DMV requirements.
- The Sandown Transfer Station remains OPEN currently.
- We ask for your continued patience doing business with the Town Offices. Staff has returned to regular hours with the exception of Monday evening. There may still be a slight delay in answering your questions, returning your phone call or processing your paperwork as things are getting caught up. Please leave a message and someone will get back to you.
