# House Numbering <br> Town Ordinance 

At the 1987 Town Meeting, Warrant Article \#48 was read, modified and voted on:
1987 TOWN WARRANT

ARTICLE 47. TO SEE TE THE TOWN WIEL VOTE TO ACCEPT COTTON FARM ROAD AS A TOWN ROAD, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN.

ARTICLE 48. TO SEE TF THE TOWN WILE VOTE TO ADOPT THE FOLIOWING ORDINANCE; ANY DWELLING NOT HAVING THE DESIGNATED HOUSE NUMBER LOCATED AT A NON-OBSCURED SITE SHALL BE SUBIECT TO A $\$ 25$ EINE FAYABLE TO THE TOWN. SAID MONTES SHALL BE USED TO PURCHASE AND LOCATE SAID NUMBER.

During the vote, Article \#48 was modified and passed:
ARTICLE 47: Acceptance of Cotton Farm Kd. fassev.
ARTICLE 48: Motion made by G. Romaine 2nd S. Wright to accept article as read. Discussion held on people obtaining house numbers and amendment made by $T$. Robinson to read "visible from public right of way" after obscured site. Amendment PASSED People will probably be given six months time to get numbers up. Motion made by E. Bassett and 2nd S. Beauvais to move the question. PASSED.

In effect, the Town Ordinance for house numbering is:
"Any dwelling not having the designated house number located at a nonobscured site visible from the public right of way shall be subject to a $\$ 25.00$ fine payable to the Town. Said monies shall be used to purchase and locate said number".
